OUR LEARNING...

This week, the children have enjoyed learning about nocturnal animals as we helped Mr Bear to understand all the noises he can hear at night. In our pathways writing books we listened for initial sounds and had a go at writing graphemes to represent. In maths, we have been pattern crazy! The children used natural objects to make repeating patterns outdoors and musical instruments to make noisy repeating patterns indoors! We made tri-colour biscuits for modern foreign language day and have ben wonderful artists creating both family portraits and autumnal trees.



Our Pathways to Write learning continues next week with the text 'Peace At Last' by Jill Murphy.

We will be designing some pizza's for Mr Bear and labelling using initial sounds we can hear. In maths, we focus on counting upto three. We will use a variety of counting objects and think about different ways to represent three.

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
