What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding'. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

There will be an increase in the Sports Premium funding in 2018-2019 and it is anticipated we will receive **£16,800 at Wimboldsley Primary School.**

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Department for Education's Purpose of funding:

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- new or additional sport clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.
- Membership to the Cheshire Oaks Sports School Partnerships – giving us access to range of CPD, enabling children to participate in a range of sporting competitions and events

How William Stockton and Wimboldsley Primary Schools will be spending the Sports Funding 2018-19 and who will benefit:


The Governors agree that the money must be used so that: **all children benefit** regardless of sporting ability; that the most able children are given the opportunity to compete in advanced tournaments; that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development; swimming is subsidised in order to support all families financially.
